From Bath, take Rt. 1 Northeast (go approximately 5.1-5.2 miles once you go over the Rt. 1 bridge from Bath) Turn right onto Montsweag Rd (If you pass the Flea Market on your left on Rt. 1 you have gone too far). Montsweag Rd is just after the shop on the right with the teepee (which may be up, but not sure if it is up this time of year). From Wiscasset, take Rt. 1 Southwest. Once you pass the Flea

Market on your right, Montsweag Rd will be on your left. Turn left on to Montsweag Rd On Montsweag Rd you will travel straight approximately 2.3 miles & come to a stop sign. Go straight across the intersection, and you are now on Phipps Point Rd. Continue straight & the farm is approximately a mile down the road. The main barn & indoor will be on your left, and pastures on your right.

- 6. Footing: 20 x 40m Indoor arena with bark footing. 20 x 60m outdoor sand arena only if weather allows. Warm up 20 x 25m indoor sand/sawdust footing.

### The AMHA Convention

The American Morgan Horse Association Annual Convention was held at the Boston Park Plaza Hotel and Towers in Boston, Massachusetts from February 23-26<sup>th</sup>, 2011. The convention was organized by Sara Foy and Jared Gove. The Youth Convention was organized by Selina Cloutier.

There were an abundance of seminars and lectures on topics so varied that anyone with an interest in horses would have found something to their liking. The AMHA also held a silent auction with highlighted items that included a once in a lifetime opportunity to ride or drive some World Champion Morgan horses including: Treble’s Tanqueray, MEM Baillamos, Dragonsmeade Icon, and Bada Bing to name a few. The Annual Stallion Service auction garnered nearly \$96,000 this year!

Friday was the day for barn tour events. Chrislar Farm (Rowley, MA-owned by Chris and Larry Cassenti) hosted a hands on event where attendees had the opportunity to ride in a Team Morgan style competition. Chris also brought out her western horse, UVM Opportunity and her Friesian, Bouke for audience members to ride. There were

very long lines for this opportunity and some people nearly missed the bus to Taylor River!

Taylor River Farm in Hampton Falls, NH was the site of the stallion presentation. Before the stallion presentation Kurt Hufferd gave a clinic on bridling and biting and was followed by Steven Debolt who spoke about starting a young horse in harness.

Then it was all eyes on the stallions! The exciting CBMF Crown Prince owned by Copper Beech was presented under saddle by Mike Goebig. Treble’s Tanqueray was all show horse in his western tack and was presented by Ashley Morris for The Fleck Family. MEM Baillamos took a few turns of the arena “at liberty”. Merriehill Home Stretch had necks stretching for a look at this exotic young park horse who was presented in harness by David Rand for owner Amy Gatewood Gendjar. Saturday was a big day as it was the day of the annual meeting. The meeting room was packed. Elections and voting results:

Elected for Regions 3, 4, 5,10 and Director At Large respectively were: Gayle Singer of IN and David Earehart of MI; Pat West of FL; Kris Breyer of IL; David Bramley of NC, and Harry Sebring of MA. These newly elected or re-elected directors join directors from Regions 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and two additional Directors at Large, making 16 positions in total on the board. At the reorganization meeting that followed, the board elected **Harry Sebring President**; Jeff Gove, VP Finance; Linnea Sidi, VP Central; Kathy Newcomb, VP Eastern; and Bill Pettis, VP Western.

AMHA also announced the results of voting on four proposed bylaw changes. Items 1, 2, and 4 passed and will be implemented immediately.

#1: Changing length of service criterion for emeriti (Voting results were 1,959 For and 372 Against)

#2: Elimination of board term limits (Voting results were 1,878 For and 459 Against)

#4: Changing the term "General member" to read "individual member" (Voting results were 2,036 For and 296 Against)

Item #3, the proposal by plaintiffs in the Hazelwood action, was defeated. (Voting results were 439 For and 1,909 Against)

The final verified results included 2,369 returned ballots, making the participation rate 37.63%, the highest voter response in many years.

The convention wrapped up with the awards banquet where our very own Katharine Thompson was honored as the Youth Person of the Year.

### **AMHA Board of Directors Seeks Immediate Rule Change from USEF**

The AMHA Board of Directors recently voted to request the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) Executive Committee, to pass an extraordinary rule change requiring riders participating in leadline classes to wear protective headgear at all times

while mounted. If passed, this rule would take effect immediately upon approval for only the Morgan division.

At the recent USEF convention, a seminar on show ring safety was presented by a guest neurologist, discussing studies coming out of the sports world on brain concussions and the importance of protective headgear while riding. The AMHA Board of Directors chose to take a position on this important safety issue, as it deals with the smallest and most vulnerable of exhibitors.

If this request is accepted at the March 21 USEF Executive Committee meeting, the rule will go into effect immediately thereafter. Another proposal which will be reviewed in the Morgan Rules Forums will be a rule requiring that all walk/trotters, regardless of tack and attire, be required to wear a helmet when mounted. If accepted, this would go into effect in 2012.

### **Annual UVM Equine Reproduction Workshop**

The UVM Morgan Horse Farm in Weybridge, Vermont, the William H. Miner Agricultural Research Institute of Chazy, New York, and the Middlebury Large Animal Clinic of Middlebury, Vermont, will host their 23rd annual Reproduction Workshop starting the afternoon of Friday, April 1 and continuing for a full day on Saturday, April 2.

The registration fee of \$250 includes workshop materials and meals. Door prizes are awarded throughout the workshop. Spaces are limited to 25 participants. Call the UVM Morgan Horse Farm at (802) 388-2011 or e-mail [uvm.morgans@uvm.edu](mailto:uvm.morgans@uvm.edu) for more information.

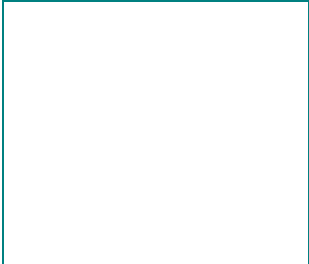
